

### Archdeacon Christine writes Give thanks!

You may have given something up for Lent or you may have taken on something extra, but alongside our Lenten observances each parish is required to hold two meetings during March or April (unless you're an early bird and held them in February!) The first is a meeting of parishioners to elect churchwardens, sometimes called the annual



parish meeting or vestry meeting. The second is the annual parochial church meeting at which those on the church's electoral roll elect the people they want to be on the PCC. In practice these two meetings are normally held one after the other. Most people do not find annual meetings of any kind a big attraction! So it is encouraging that some parishes try to use the occasion of the annual meeting for more than elections and the approval of reports and accounts. The annual report can be an opportunity to review the past year. An extended gathering over lunch can give time to plan for the year ahead. Whatever form the annual meeting takes it can be, above all, an opportunity to give thanks. Whether the past year has been encouraging or difficult we can still give thanks. We can give thanks for those who have served as churchwardens and members of the PCC: for those who assist in preparing for and leading worship: for those who work with children and young people; for those who visit the sick and housebound, not forgetting the clergy and licensed lay ministers ...... The list can go on and on, but that surely is the point. As we give thanks to particular people for their particular gifts we recognise that all these gifts are God-given, and we are led to give thanks to God. Yet how often. I wonder, do we give those outside the church, or on the fringe, an impression that we spend most of our time complaining about what is wrong rather than rejoicing and giving thanks for all that God has given us? Of course, cultivating a spirit of thankfulness to God and to each other is not something we should be doing only once a year. If it pervades the life of our church community it can transform our worship, our whole outlook on life, our mission.



### EGLETON NEWS

St. Edmund's Church was full to the doors – the South Porch doors and beyond – as his family and friends assembled on February 8<sup>th</sup> to make a worthy Memorial for one of Egleton's native, veteran parishioners.

Norman John Hubbard was known and respected by his time-honoured pet name TICKER. Even his Memorial Service Paper was emblazoned with this title; so much did Norman John rejoice in his distinctive, endearing form of address.

Norman was one of Egleton's few contemporaries who are also proud survivors from its traditional farming community. Like his father before him, Ticker was identified with Longcroft Farm at the heart of the village until, in the early Nineties, he set up a New Farmstead, close to the Uppingham Road.

Most specifically he formed a close attachment to horses, a passion shared with his wife Jane: together they became widely recognized for their equestrian joys and achievements. This grand passion is well illustrated by the verses read in the course of the Thanksgiving Service for Ticker's life and times ...

"The hoofs of the horses! Oh, witching and sweet
Is the music earth steals from the iron-shod feet:
No whisper of lover, no trilling of bird
Can stir me as hoofs of the horses have stirred.

They spurn disappointment and trample despair, And drown with their drum-beats the challenge of care; With scarlet and silk for their banners above They are swifter than fortune and sweeter than love.

On the wings of the morning they gather and fly, In the hush of the night-time I hear them go by-The horses of memory thundering through With flashing white fetlocks all wet with the dew.

When you lay me to slumber no sport you can choose But will ring to the rhythm of galloping shoes;

And under the daisies no grave be so deep But the hoofs of the horses shall sound in my sleep! "




