It's now the day after Ascension Day; John and I had elected to go to the evening service at St John and St Anne's Chapel, and I have to admit that I was preoccupied with what to write about in this letter to the magazine...till I walked into the Chapel, and remembered the first time I had entered it after its reconsecration in 1983 (THAT long ago?). I had been invited, along with many others, to attend as the Queen and Prince Philip made their visitation.

The Queen was escorted into the Chapel by Rev Alan Horsley – I was in the second row about 5 in from the main door. I shall never forget the look that came over Her Majesty as she entered the small Chapel. She paused for several seconds, and audibly gasped. She then moved along the front row of dignitaries, shaking hands – and looking everyone in the eye, yes, everyone (even me on the second row). A tiny lady, but she has an amazing presence, and seems to have the ability to embrace all in her path, just with a glance. I can't remember what I wore, but her outfit was bright emerald green, not a crease in sight; the Duke of Edinburgh wore his usual shabby beige mackintosh...

What memories do you have? I am old enough to remember the King's death; our front curtains were closed for a week at least. Then the Coronation – my Dad replaced our 9" television with a 15", especially for the day (he worked for GEC so had all the latest gismos).

Last night, reports were on the television about the Queen's Jubilee visit to Manchester and surrounding areas (not been there since 1956), but the love and joy of the people who turned out to greet her was very obvious. Not only does she embrace us, but she also seems to have the quality to bring out the best in us.

Much will have been written about her 60 years on the throne – the changes, the ups and downs for our society, and for her and her family. But as we wait now for the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, just

as the disciples waited back in Jerusalem after the Ascension of our Lord, Jesus Christ, can I ask you to use this prayer, written at the Queen's direction by the Chapter of St Paul's Cathedral, now and in the months to come:

God of time and eternity, whose Son reigns as servant, not master; we give you thanks and praise that you have blessed this Nation, the Realms and Territories with ELIZABETH, our beloved and glorious Queen. In this year of Jubilee, grant her your gifts of love and joy and peace as she continues in faithful obedience to you, her Lord and God and in devoted service to her lands and peoples, and those of the Commonwealth, now and all the days of her life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

And may the Holy Spirit be with us all as we celebrate, wherever we may be and in whatever way (we shall be on the beach in Cornwall with the grandchildren – bunting and flags and special hats already purchased). God bless Elizabeth our Queen, and long may she reign!



The Dean of Peterborough writes Daft old brush provides role model "When Peter heard it was the Lord, he put on some clothes...and jumped into the sea." (John

21:7)

What a daft old brush! Most of us would surely remove our clothes before diving in, not put them back on! But that's Peter for you – impetuously enthusiastic, not particularly renowned for engaging brain before opening mouth or leaping into action.



He was, as one of my colleagues would say, "more ready to be generous than right"; which perhaps explains why some find him to be among the more loveable of the apostles, together with his willingness to learn and his capacity for bouncing back after being knocked down.

It has been said of clergy that in the early years of an appointment they are scrutinized and for the remainder of their incumbency they are criticized; but when they leave or retire they are idolized and, finally, canonized.

This has been the case for most if not all the Archbishops of Canterbury in recent generations, whose lot is to be truly appreciated only when they've gone. It does little credit to the way we sometimes conduct our debates and readily malign our chief pastors that Rowan Williams observed that his successor will need "the constitution of an ox and the skin of rhinoceros."

In this month of June, we celebrate the Feast of our Diocesan and Cathedral Patron, Saint Peter. As we do so, let us pray that Archbishop Rowan's successor will have not only bovine strength and a rhinoceric hide; but more especially a Petrine heart — even if such enthusiasm, willingness to make mistakes but equal readiness to learn and bounce back, make him seem a bit of a daft brush in the eyes of this world.

And let us also pray that we too might be prepared more often to be generous rather than always claiming to be right.

Around the diocese Bishop says put children first

Church schools are one of the most important things that the church does, Bishop Donald told 100 or so people gathered to bid farewell to Diocesan Director of Education Dr Stephen



Partridge, who is retired at the end of April. Bishop Donald reminded the audience that "church isn't the place for grown-ups where children are sometimes allowed to attend. Church is for everyone. "Put the children first," he urged, "and approach God in a simple childlike way, and then we'll get everything else right."

Turning to the children gathered from four local schools, he reminded them that they are

precious to God. "Jesus loves you and wants you to know and love him," he said.

The service of thanksgiving and farewell in St Andrew's Church Kettering was led by Archdeacon Christine who is also chair of the Diocesan Board of Education. Bishop Donald thanked her for her leadership of the Board and they each wore specially-made stoles decorated with the badges of all 104 church schools in the diocese.

Archdeacon Christine paid tribute to Stephen Partridge's work, enthusiasm and attention to detail. She quoted a letter from former Diocesan Mission Enabler Tim Sledge who said, "Stephen is a one off, a one-man whirling dynamo of creative ideas and energy." Children from St Mary's and St Andrew's primary schools in

Kettering sang He's got the whole world in his hands and children from All Saints Primary School in Northampton sang Rutter's The Lord bless you and keep you. Students from Bishop Stopford School led the opening acclamations. A farewell commendation was led by Tim Short (Board of Education), Joan Gibson (Head of Oakham Primary



School) and Gill Nunn, a governor of Culworth Primary School. Stephen was presented with a visitors book for his B&B in France from Board Chair Hilary Spenceley, a cheque by the Archdeacon (below), and flowers for his wife Ivana. He paid tribute to the hard work and support of his former and current staff, and of schools and governors.

Cathedral confirmation for Cheryl and son

For bishop's secretary Cheryl Craggs and her son Luke (14), the Easter Eve Confirmation service at Peterborough Cathedral this year was unforgettable.



Not only were they both amongst the

38 candidates for Confirmation, but both her "bosses" were there too. Bishop John anointed the candidates and Bishop Donald Confirmed them.

Cheryl started working for the bishops in September 2010 and it wasn't long before she asked Bishop Donald about Confirmation. With his gentle encouragement she started going to the evening classes led by Jonathan Baker and Jenny Opperman at the Cathedral.

She was joined by Luke and both of them found the teaching and Bible study sessions thought provoking and challenging. "There was no pressure and we both felt able to take part in the discussions," said Cheryl, who had the advantage of being able to ask her bishop's office colleagues about anything she didn't understand.

Daughter Rebecca (12) and husband Les were among their supporters at the service, which began dramatically when a fire was ignited at the west door, from which numerous candles were lit in the darkened Cathedral.

The Church and Roof Repair Appeal was launched at Sunday 27th May 9am Service.


