Gospel Reading – Luke 4.16-24

We are also currently looking at the production of a Welcome Pack for new members and visitors.

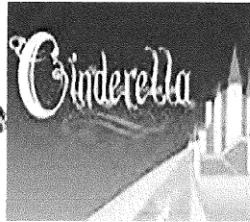
