First Reading – Jeremiah 15.15-21

Presentation of the Candidates

The president addresses the whole congregation

Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me. Do not stop them'.

We thank God for Ella Christine who has come to be baptized today. Christ loves her and welcomes her into his Church.

So I ask you all:

Will you support Ella as she begins her journey of faith?

All We will.

Will you help her to live and grow within God's family?

All We will.

The president addresses the parents and godparents

God knows each of us by name and we are his. Parents and godparents, you speak for Ella today. Will you pray for her, and help her to follow Christ? **We will.**

The Decision

The president addresses the candidate through her parents and godparents

We all wander far from God and lose our way: Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home. In baptism we respond to his call.

Therefore I ask:

Do you turn away from sin? **I do.**

Do you reject evil? I do.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? I do.

Do you trust in him as Lord? I do.

Signing with the Cross

The minister makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of the candidate, saying

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.

When the candidate has been signed, the president says

Do not be ashamed of Christ. You are his for ever.

All Stand bravely with him against all the powers of evil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

All Amen.

Prayer over the Water

The president stands before the water of baptism and says

Praise God who made heaven and earth,

All who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All It is right to give thanks and praise.

We praise you, loving Father, for the gift of your Son Jesus. He was baptized in the River Jordan, where your Spirit came upon him and revealed him as the Son you love He sent his followers to baptize all who turn to him. Now, Father, we ask you to bless this water, that those who are baptized in it may be cleansed in the water of life, and, filled with your Spirit and know that they are loved as your children, safe in Christ for ever.

Profession of Faith

The president addresses the congregation

Let us affirm, together with Ella who is being baptized, our common faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, source of all being and life, the one for whom we exist?

All I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son, who took our human nature, died for us and rose again?

All I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God and makes Christ known in the world?

All I believe and trust in him.

This the faith of the Church.

All This is our faith. We believe and trust in one God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Baptism

The minister pours water on the candidate, saying

Ella Christine, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

The president says

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church, pour upon you the riches of his grace, that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit, and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory.

All Amen.

The ministers and candidate return to their places.

The Welcome and Peace

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism: by one Spirit we are all baptized into one body.

The president introduces the Peace in these or other suitable words. We are all one in Christ Jesus.
