First Reading – Isaiah 53.4-12

Surely he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; yet we accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth. By a perversion of justice he was taken away. Who could have imagined his future? For he was cut off from the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people. They made his grave with the wicked and his tomb with the rich, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth. Yet it was the will of the LORD to crush him with pain. Therefore I will allot him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he poured out himself to death, and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

Reading – Mark 10.35-45

Dissent, conscience and the Church: the growth of religious dissent after 1689. Speaker – Dr David Wykes. It was a surprise to the bishops that nonconformity did not die out with the ministers ejected in 1662, but they failed to understand the continuing long-term demands for a godly religion from a significant part of society. By 1690 more than half those actively preaching had entered the ministry since 1662. Though they had not faced the same difficulties as the ejected ministers, many found on close enquiry that they could not accept episcopal ordination or the oaths and subscriptions required. This paper will look at the reasons why dissent continued and why the period after 1689 was one of considerable evangelical growth. Dr David Wykes is Director of Dr Williams's Library, London. He is the author of many essays and articles on late seventeenth- and early eighteenth-century dissent, and late eighteenth and early nineteenth-century rational dissent and Unitarianism. He is currently working on a study of religious dissent during the twenty-five year period after the Glorious Revolution.
