First Reading – Isaiah 43.1-7*

Thus says the LORD, he who created you, O Jacob, he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour. I give Egypt as your ransom, Ethiopia and Seba in exchange for you. Because you are precious in my sight, and honoured, and I love you, I give people in return for you, nations in exchange for your life. Do not fear, for I am with you; I will bring your offspring from the east, and from the west I will gather you; I will say to the north, 'Give them up', and to the south, 'Do not withhold; bring my sons from far away and my daughters from the end of the earth — everyone who is called by my name, whom I created for my glory, whom I formed and made.'

Second Reading – Acts 8.14-17

When the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them. The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus). Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Gospel – Luke 3.15-17,21-22

(In the wilderness John proclaimed a baptism of repentance.) As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah, John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.' Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened, and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

Rutland Foodbank still needs YOU

This time not for donations but to try and find people we have yet to reach. The Trussell Trust stats show just what categories they may fall into. Are they too proud to ask for help? Don't know how to access us or the referral agencies? Don't know about us? Elderly with the dilemma of choosing between heating and eating? Please help. Emma Revie, Chief Executive, says As a nation we expect no-one should be left hungry or destitute – illness, disability, family breakdown or the loss of a job could happen to any of us, and we owe it to each other to make sure sufficient financial support is in place when we need it most. It's hard to break free from hunger if there isn't enough money coming in to cover the rising cost of absolute essentials like food and housing. For too many people, staying above water is a daily struggle. It's completely unacceptable that anyone is forced to turn to a foodbank as a result. Primary referral causes in 2017/18 to Trussell Trust Foodbanks (reasons under 1% include delayed wages, child holiday meals and refused STBA):

1. Low Income (28.49%)	
2. Benefit Delays (23.74%)	
3. Benefit Changes (17.73%)	
4. Debt (8.53%)	
5. Other (7.57%)	
6. Homeless (5.01%)	
7. Sickness / Ill Health (2.86%)	
8. No recourse to public funds (2.69%)	
9. Domestic Abuse (1.41%)

We were very pleased to have The Revd Stephen Griffiths join us for the first time. Patsy Clifton was admitted as member of the Mothers' Union, and was greeted with a round of applause. It was sad to hear the news that Christine Carlin had passed away suddenly. All members joined in sending their deepest sympathy to her family. She will be missed. The meeting closed with the blessing and happy Christmas to all. The next meeting will be Thursday 10 January at 2.15pm in the Church Hall. This will be the AGM, and all are welcome.

Advent in Braunston

Thank you to everyone who supported the Braunston Church Advent Fayre, where there was a great mix of traditional and interesting new items on sale. The total raised was a fantastic $\pounds 2,300$ which helped to swell the repair fund! And also huge thanks to everyone who participated in Braunston's first Living Advent Windows event. All the displays, phone box included, looked fabulous. Well done everyone. We had 30 households take part.

Braunston Bat Boxes

Our Heritage Lottery funding for 2019 has been confirmed and this allows us to make the blocking work inside the church permanent. The bats can continue to roost in the south aisle roof, but this work prevents them getting into the interior of the church and will stop the fouling of the pews, walls and floors, so everyone - bats and humans alike - is happy! Additionally, the funding covers the installation of a bat box on a pole in the churchyard extension paddock, which we hope will provide an additional roost for the bats outside the church. The blocking work, and hopefully the bat box installation as well, is planned for early April.

Braunston Repairs Update

A big thank you to the many people across the village who have made generous donations towards the urgent repairs required to keep our village Church watertight. So far, £38,000 has been raised, which means that there are just £13,000 in gift-aided donations needed. If you would like to make a donation to take us to the £54.000 total, please make a cheque payable to "Braunston PCC" and send it with your name and address and a note confirming Gift Aid may be claimed (if applicable) to Pat Anderson, PCC Treasurer, 52 Church Street. Braunston, Donation forms are also available inside the Church or contact Pat Anderson on 774388 for more details.

Oakham PCC - 22 Nov

A comprehensive report on safeguarding issues was given by our Safeguarding Officer, Ruth Bray, and a copy of Promoting a Safer Church is in the Church Office. Finance: Drafting of the 2019 budget awaited insurance costs (likely to be down after the installation of roof alarm system) and Parish Share costs for 2019 and salaries updates. Current giving is still down and the PCC is discussing a possible future stewardship campaign. Details of our mission giving for 2018 and a proposal for cashless giving are in hand. Fabric: proposals to replace external floodlighting are in hand (current system stems back to early 1990s); regulating the clock has been a problem as a result of installation of the roof alarm system (both sharing the same radio signal), but this has now been resolved; our hard-working fabric group's advised priority

scheduling for work to be done was agreed, and the decaying louvres (1940s?) will be dealt with as soon as quotes have been approved and subject to available funding (grants?); it was also agreed that the amount for unexpected problems be increased to £1000 without reference to the PCC, provided funding is available; future plans will include the introduction of a moveable handrail/ramp at the step to the Trinity Chapel, and the current audio system (23 years old) replacement is being urgently investigated (two quotes now received). Our next PCC meeting is on Thursday 24 January 2019 and a Team Council drawn from the whole benefice has been established, meeting quarterly. The full draft minutes are available on the noticeboard at the North Door, Marilyn Tomalin, PCC Secretary.
