Our Lord Jesus Christ has told us

and God calls us to fullness of life.

## *We Listen To God's Word*

### First Reading – Acts 9.36-43

In Joppa there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity. At that time she became ill and died. When they had washed her, they laid her in a room

upstairs. Since Lydda was near Joppa, the disciples, who heard that Peter was there, sent two men to him with the request, 'Please come to us without delay.' So Peter got up and went with them; and when he arrived, they took him to the room upstairs. All the widows stood beside him, weeping and showing tunics and other clothing that Dorcas had made while she was with them. Peter put all of them outside, and then he knelt down and prayed. He turned to the body and said, 'Tabitha, get up.' Then she opened her eyes, and seeing Peter, she sat up. He gave her his hand and helped her up. Then calling the saints and widows, he showed her to be alive. This became known throughout Joppa, and many believed in the Lord. Meanwhile he stayed in Joppa for some time with a certain Simon, a tanner.

This is the word of the Lord.

### **Second Reading – Revelation 7.9-17\***

After this I looked, and there was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, robed in white, with palm branches in their hands. They cried out in a loud voice, saying, 'Salvation belongs to our God who is seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!' And all the angels stood around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, singing, 'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and might be to our God for ever and ever! Amen.' Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, 'Who are these, robed in white, and where have they come from?' I said to him, 'Sir, you are the one that knows.' Then he said to me, 'These are they who have come out of the great ordeal; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. For this reason they are before the throne of God, and worship him day and night within his temple, and the one who is seated on the throne will shelter them. They will hunger no more, and thirst no more; the sun will not strike them, nor any scorching heat; for the Lamb at the centre of the throne will be their shepherd, and he will guide them to springs of the water of life, and God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.'

## **Presentation of the Candidates**

*The president addresses the whole congregation*

Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me. Do not stop them'.

We thank God for Jake Richy,

Parents and godparents, you speak for Jake today.

Will you pray for him,  
and help him to follow Christ?

**We will.**

## **The Decision**

*The president addresses the candidate through her parents and godparents*

We all wander far from God and lose our way:

Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home.

In baptism we respond to his call.

Therefore I ask:

Do you turn away from sin?

**I do.**

Do you reject evil?

**I do.**

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

**I do.**

Do you trust in him as Lord?

**I do.**

## Signing with the Cross

*The minister makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of the candidate, saying*

Christ claims you for his own.  
Receive the sign of his cross.

*When the candidate has been signed, the president says*

Do not be ashamed of Christ.  
You are his for ever.

*All* **Stand bravely with him  
against all the powers of evil,  
and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.**

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness,  
and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

*All* **Amen.**

## Profession of Faith

*The president addresses the congregation*

Let us affirm,  
together with Jake,  
our common faith in Jesus Christ.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father,  
source of all being and life,  
the one for whom we exist?

*All* **I believe and trust in him.**

Do you believe and trust in God the Son,  
who took our human nature,  
died for us and rose again?

*All* **I believe and trust in him.**

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit,  
who gives life to the people of God  
and makes Christ known in the world?

*All* **I believe and trust in him.**

This the faith of the Church.

*All* **This is our faith.  
We believe and trust in one God,  
Father, Son and Holy Spirit.**

## Prayer over the Water

*The ministers and candidates gather at the baptismal font.*

The president stands before the water of baptism and says

*All* Praise God who made heaven and earth,  
**who keeps his promise for ever.**

*All* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
**It is right to give thanks and praise.**

We praise you, loving Father,  
for the gift of your Son Jesus.  
He was baptized in the River Jordan,  
where your Spirit came upon him  
and revealed him as the Son you love  
He sent his followers  
to baptize all who turn to him.  
Now, Father, we ask you to bless this water,  
that those who are baptized in it  
may be cleansed in the water of life,  
and, filled with your Spirit  
and know that they are loved as your children,  
safe in Christ for ever.

*All* **Amen.**

## Baptism

*The minister pours water on the candidate, saying*

Jake Richy,  
I baptize you  
in the name of the Father,  
and of the Son,  
and of the Holy Spirit.

*All* **Amen.**

*The president says*

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church,  
pour upon you the riches of his grace,  
that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people  
you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit,  
and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory.

*All* **Amen.**

## The Welcome and Peace

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism:  
by one Spirit we are all baptized into one body.

**All** **We welcome you into the fellowship of faith;  
we are children of the same heavenly Father;  
we welcome you.**

*The president introduces the Peace in these or other suitable words.*

We are all one in Christ Jesus.

We belong to him through faith, heirs of the promise of the Spirit of peace.

**All** The peace of the Lord be always with you  
**and also with you.**

*A minister may say*

Let us offer one another a sign of peace.

*All may exchange a sign of peace.*
