First Reading – *Proverbs 25.6-7**

Do not put yourself forward in the king's presence or stand in the place of the great; for it is better to be told, 'Come up here', than to be put lower in the presence of a noble.

Second Reading – *Hebrews 13.1-8,15,16*

Let mutual love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it. Remember those who are in prison, as though you were in prison with them; those who are being tortured, as though you yourselves were being tortured. Let marriage be held in honour by all, and let the marriage bed be kept undefiled; for God will judge fornicators and adulterers. Keep your lives free from the love of money, and be content with what you have; for he has said, 'I will never leave you or forsake you.' So we can say with confidence, 'The Lord is my helper; I will not be afraid. What can anyone do to me?' Remember your leaders, those who spoke the word of God to you; consider the outcome of their way of life, and imitate their faith. Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and for ever. Through him, then, let us continually offer a sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of lips that confess his name. A portrait of monastic life in Anglo-Saxon England, **Not Just Fish and Ships** is a courtroom drama with a light touch, with more than a little resonance for our own quarrelsome times. Good news to start with and grateful thanks to all who arranged and supported the Summer Fayre, raising £1,237; plans already afoot for the Autumn Fayre, and for a summer one in June 2020. Some worship matters were discussed – renewal of licences for Communion Assistants, and changes to third Sunday 10.30 lectionary readings to build more flexibility into that service were agreed, and reinstatement of a Worship Forum. Provision of a wireless telephone to help in emergencies is in hand. Finance report from Peter Hill shows little change from his last statement – tax recovery down, gift aid donations down, fabric costs up (louvres and window repairs).
