Collect

First Reading – Isaiah 45.22-25*

Turn to me and be saved, all the ends of the earth! For I am God, and there is no other. By myself I have sworn, from my mouth has gone forth in righteousness a word that shall not return: 'To me every knee shall bow, every tongue shall swear.' Only in the Lord, it shall be said of me, are righteousness and strength; all who were incensed against him shall come to him and be ashamed. In the Lord all the offspring of Israel shall triumph and glory.

Second Reading – Romans 15.1-6

We who are strong ought to put up with the failings of the weak, and not to please ourselves. Each of us must please our neighbour for the good purpose of building up the neighbour. For Christ did not please himself; but, as it is written, 'The insults of those who insult you have fallen on me.' For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, so that by steadfastness and by the encouragement of the scriptures we might have hope. May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, so that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Gospel – Luke 4.16-24

When he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written: 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.' And he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to say to them, 'Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.' All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They said, 'Is not this Joseph's son?' He said to them, 'Doubtless you will quote to me this proverb, "Doctor, cure yourself!" And you will say, "Do here also in your home town the things that we have heard you did at Capernaum." And he said, 'Truly I tell you, no prophet is accepted in the prophet's home town.





- I. I cannot tell why he, whom angels worship, should set his love upon the sons of men, or why, as Shepherd, he should seek the wanderers, to bring them back, they know not how or when. But this I know, that he was born of Mary when Bethl'em's manger was his only home, and that He lived at Nazareth and laboured, and so the Saviour, Saviour of the world, is come.
- 2. I cannot tell how silently he suffered, as with his peace he graced this place of tears, or how his heart upon the cross was broken, the crown of pain to three and thirty years.But this I know, he heals the broken-hearted, and stays our sin, and calms our lurking fear, and lifts the burden from the heavy laden;For yet the Saviour, Saviour of the world, is here.
- 3. I cannot tell how he will win the nations, how He will claim his earthly heritage, how satisfy the needs and aspirations of east and west, of sinner and of sage.

 But this I know, all flesh shall see his glory, and he shall reap the harvest he has sown, and some glad day his sun shall shine in splendour when he the Saviour, Saviour of the world, is known.
- 4. I cannot tell how all the lands shall worship, when, at his bidding, every storm is stilled, or who can say how great the jubilation when every heart with love and joy is filled. But this I know, the skies will thrill with rapture, and myriad, myriad human voices sing, and earth to heav'n, and heav'n to earth, will answer, 'at last the Saviour, Saviour of the world, is King!'

I have been both challenged and blessed by exploring The Beatitudes with a group of Catmose students this last term. They wanted to explore faith and, rather than just talk about what we believe, we tried looking at it from the perspective of practising the way of Jesus, using Jesus' simple yet profound teaching - his 'nine statement manifesto'. It feels only right that I now share this with those of us who truly seek to follow him and put into practice his life-giving words, and therefore I have drawn up a plan for us to explore these words together over the next year, looking at one beatitude a month, excluding April (Lent & Easter) and August (summer holidays). There will be an introductory evening on Monday 4 November, 7-9pm, at

3 Paddock Close, Whissendine, LE15 7HW – 7pm for drinks, puddings and chat, then 7.30-9pm Introduction to the Beatitudes.

Following this there will be the opportunity to meet monthly on Mondays at the same time: 2 Dec -Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven; 6 Jan - Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted: **3 Feb** – Blessed are the meek. for they will inherit the earth; 2 Mar -Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for justice, for they will be satisfied: 4 May - Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy; I Jun - Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God; 6 Jul - Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God; 7 Sep -Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven; **5 Oct** – Blessed are you when people treat you badly for my sake, rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven; **2 Nov** – Review practising the way of Jesus using his 'nine statement manifesto' does it live up to its promises...?; If there is demand, there could be a monthly Wednesday morning group as well. We are pleased to welcome Rachel as Associate Minister in the Oakham Team Ministry. She was licensed at All Saints Oakham on Wednesday by the Bishop of Brixworth, and serves as a Minister in Secular Employment, with her main focus being her employment at the Air Ambulance Shop.

Project Sukkot Update

Churches Together is working to establish a house in Oakham where we can give a home to homeless people. We are doing this in partnership with the Peterborough charity *Hope into Action* who run around 70 such projects around the country. Our aim is not only to provide a roof and a bed, but also to share the joy of the Gospel and help our residents rebuild the confidence and skills they need to move into an

ordinary tenancy. We, the churches, bring an extra ingredient to the project, which is the love of God. We now have sufficient investment pledges, and the Steering Group is now taking forward a series of parallel work-streams – firstly, to answer any final questions and confirm investor intentions. We are inviting investors to a meeting on 5 November where we will ask for a definite commitment. The investors will work together through a legal trust, and we will invite three or four of them to act as trustees: then we can look for the right house, working with the nomineetrustees. Once we have had an offer accepted, we formally constitute the trust, gather the money, and complete the purchase. There will then be some hard work to organise any refurbishment work that is needed, and to furnish the house. We believe strongly that the house should have high-quality fittings - this is a practical way to show to the residents that we care for and respect them. At this stage we will be asking the churches for support – gifts of money, skills, time and high-quality household equipment. Meanwhile, we will be gathering befrienders and supporters. Hope into Action can provide training to help us be the best support we can to our residents. We are working on who would be the best people to live in the house. From the beginning, we have felt that God has called us into this project. 'May Your Kingdom come, on earth as in heaven', as we pray each day. Please continue to pray for the project: for the Steering Group, who are busy; for

investors, supporters and everyone involved, that we might allow the Holy Spirit in our hearts to draw us into an effective team; for our future residents – we don't know them yet, but God does! – that they might find healing and the love of God through our work.






