Dear friends,

A reading from the Book of Jeremiah

A reading from the letter to the Ephesians

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. He destined us for adoption as his children through lesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses according to the riches of his grace that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight he has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in Christ, things in heaven and things on earth. In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance, having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit; this is the pledge of our inheritance towards redemption as God's own people to the praise of his glory.

Gospel Reading – John 1:1-18

Here the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John. Glory to you, O Lord.

Hope into Action

With the Good News of the birth of our Lord at Christmas, there comes some good news too from the Hope into Action project in Oakham. In our first house, which we now refer to as Osprey, there have been some recent changes. In the past few days we are very pleased to say that one of our tenants has been able to move out into private rented accommodation and his place in the house has been taken up by a new tenant. The purchase and refurbishment of the second house. which we now refer to as Fieldfare. has taken a while longer than at first anticipated, but we are thrilled to say that two tenants will now be moving in before Christmas. Many people, from all churches, have been involved in enabling us to reach this point. From overseeing the legal process and managing the financial transactions, to all that's been involved in the refurbishing, redecorating and furnishing of Fieldfare. Then too, there has been the ongoing befriending and support of our tenants and liaising with the County Council – all to ensure that five formerly homeless people can now feel that they are cared for through

these practical expressions of God's love. And we want to say a special thank you too, to everyone who has so generously contributed gifts for the Christmas hampers which we will be delivering to both houses. Prayers for our tenants, and for you all, will be offered at Fieldfare this coming week. We wish you all a very Happy Christmas.

RUTLAND & MELTON CANCER SUPPORT GROUP HELP FOR CANCER PATIENTS & CARERS

Just over twenty years ago, a nurse called Carol Morton returned to her flat in Oakham having had major cancer surgery. She felt extremely lonely,, missing the wonderful care which she had received in hospital. As a result of this, she started the Rutland and Melton Cancer Support Group, which has been befriending and helping cancer patients in this area ever since then.

Did you know that voluntary help for cancer patients in Rutland is now almost nonexistent? Very sadly, Dove Cottage Day Hospice at Ridlington has had to close, (although the wonderful volunteers who helped there are hoping to continue keeping in touch with their visitors), the Macmillan Befriending Service run from Uppingham has also closed, as has the Holly hocks Support Group in Ketton. This leaves a big gap in the care of cancer patients in Rutland.

PLEASE THINK ABOUT IIT CAREFULLY

Like so many other charities, the two Lock-Downs have proved very difficult for us as well. Without our monthly meetings in both Oakham and Melton, and the impossibility of visiting people in their own homes, we have found it hard to keep in touch.

We have also lost some valued members of our committee, who wished to retire but had remained until life returned to normal before resigning. We need to replace them urgently SO WE ASRE ASKING FOR YOUR HELP....

Firstly, are you a cancer patient who would appreciate joining a group which offers friendship and support to any local cancer patient.

Secondly, do you have any spare time and would like to do something which will make a difference to the lives of local cancer patients? We are looking for help running a befriending service, or a few hours a month on the administrative side.
