COMMENT

Matthew 6.1–6, 16–21 (CW/RCL/RL): This powerful teaching of Jesus about prayer, fasting and devotion is a clarion call that lies at the heart of Christian spirituality. It flies in the face of Pharisaic observance – rather, Jesus calls us to personal devotion and relationship with God.

John 8.1–11 (CW): The story of the 'woman caught in adultery' is apposite for the beginning of Lent when we reflect on our own sinfulness and try to step away from judging others to focus on our own need for mercy. When Jesus is quizzed with trick questions by the Pharisees, his response is to ask even trickier ones in return.
